January President's message 2017

Merry Epiphany! We had great Advent and Christmas seasons. Thank you to everyone who was part of preparing and executing a warm and meaningful remembrance of our savior's birth. Musicians and Play Leaders, Cooks and Readers, Singers and Gift Wrappers, Clergy and Members, Snow Shovelers and Gutter Cleaners, Ushers and Greeters, thank you everyone.

I want to especially thank Dave Palumbo. He has been our Treasurer for many years. Dave was instrumental in creating an understandable and transparent accounting and reporting system. We could not have kept expenditures below revenue for 14 consecutive years without Dave's hard work and guidance. I am pleased to announce that Beth Shaheen has volunteered to take on the position. Dave will help Beth get comfortable with the processes and tools he developed.

We have upgraded the computers for both the Secretary and the Pastor. The old machine was at least 10 years old. It was time. This will provide a strong productivity tool for the office and a new pastor when he/she arrives.

This fall we spent our time understanding what it takes to run this community ourselves. Pastor Sherwindt took care of so many things that we as lay people have forgotten (or maybe never knew) what our jobs were supposed to be. We have come through that period stronger for having walked through it. This community has stepped up. We are getting much more organized. Vicki is doing a great job as a central clearing house for information and a presidential goad. Our finances are in pretty good shape. As of December 15th we were a little behind the power curve but not much and for the first time in a while, we have a secretary in the office five days a week. We have the Parsonage rented which will help a lot. We have a functioning Mutual Ministry. The church property looks great. We are holding our own on the membership rolls. These are all great signs and all thanks to member's hard work and dedication.

Now we come to the new year. New Years is a time for self-improvement. It is a time for resolutions to be better, happier and thinner: It is time for the congregation to take the next steps. We are ready to begin the very hard work of discernment. What is God calling us to do and be? What sort of pastor do we want? What sort of community do we want? Where do we want to go? That is the next task to be accomplished. We are going to do several things to make this happen.

First, at the January 10th Council Meeting we will constitute a Call Committee. This is a group of seven or nine folks to work with Pastor Bierman from the NEO Synod office to write the Congregational Profile, which describes our community and what we are looking for. Then they will interview potential pastors. In the end they will recommend a candidate to Council for approval.



The Call Committee cannot do that work in a vacuum. They need input from the rest of us. That input will come from several events. On January 15th we will have a guest preacher. I have called in every favor I had and persuaded the Rev. Alastair Votaw (yep my dad and getting him to come from South Carolina in January was a feat). He will be talking about transitioning church communities and how we can think about God's will as we walk through this process. Please See: **Singing the Lord's Song** on Page 5. He has been an Episcopal Priest since 1963 and has had a lot of experience in helping congregations to work through lots of issues. We will have a workshop/brunch on Sunday, January 15th.


Then toward the end of January and beginning of February we will have a series of Home Meetings. Pastor Robarge and Council will moderate a group of small group meetings where people are asked about where they see things going. The consensus and issues developed in these meetings will inform the Call Committee as they complete the Congregational Profile.

So we have a busy season coming up. This is an important time for our congregation. This is the time when we stand up and move from 200 year or tradition to 220 years and beyond of vibrant life as we celebrate growing and serving through the grace of Jesus Christ. Again, Council thanks each and every one of you for your support. There are tasks for anyone who wants to serve. Listen for that small voice and give Vicki a call.

Singing the Lord's Song

This November, I was in Charleston, SC on business. I decided to stay the weekend and visit my dad. The only complication was that weekend was the Diocesan Annual Convention (like our Synod Convention in June). My dad had to be there so I tagged along. I listened to their new Provisional Bishop, Rt. Rev. "Skip" Adams, deliver a really powerful message that he titled, "How do we sing the Lord's song in a



strange land?" (Read or watch the sermon here: <https://goo.gl/3GljOS>) He took this familiar quote from Isaiah and reached out to his new flock. In South Carolina, the Episcopal Church moving through the aftermath of an ugly split over LGBT issues and the racial tension over two nasty criminal trials. Bishop Adams calls out three issues:

- 1) We recognize that we are in a strange land.
- 2) How Do we Sing God's Song?
- 3) What is our Response to the song?

I listened to him talking to folks about moving forward even when the times are tough, even when we are not sure what the next steps are, even when we have to make tough decisions. I kept hearing the same issues in our lives as we move through the Call Process. 1) We all feel a little weird about choosing a new leader for this community. 2) How do we know what God wants? 3) How do we move through this in a way that cements us together as a community of faith? I found myself wishing that I could bring Bishop Adams up to speak to our Lutheran family. I knew that would not work. But I talked my dad into bringing us this message. (See President's Message Page 4)

Congregations go through changes in leadership all the time. In the Northeast Ohio Synod right now nearly 20% of congregations are somewhere in the Call Process or have been in the last year. So this is clearly not strange for the institution. But it is strange for us as individuals, especially here at Zion where we tend to hang onto clergy for a long time. So I think Bishop Adams message has a lot to say to us as we move through this strange land. The good news is that we have the liberty to do this in a slow, discerning and deliberative way. We have time and space to listen for the small voice in the night to guide us. Come January 15th (and maybe 14th) and visit with Rev. Al Votaw as we learn to hear God's Song in this strange land.

Worship Ministry Purpose

Our purpose is to equip people of all ages to respond to God’s call by regularly participating in the celebration of Word and Sacrament. The ministry team is made up of: Pastor, Worship Elder, organist, choir director, member of Chancel Guild, head of ushers and acolytes.

The team shall:

- A. Assist the Pastor and the Council in seeing that the celebration of Word and Sacrament is conducted in accordance with the liturgical teachings of the Evangelical Lutheran Church.
- B. Recruit and train Users, Lay Assistants, Lectors and Acolytes.
- C. Chancel Guild cares for hymnals and other worship material. Also they care of paraments, vestments of the church
- D. The musical instruments are taking care by the Worship team.
- E. In consultation with the Pastor, organist, and choir director, shall furnish music supplies appropriate for use in the celebration of Word and Sacrament.
- F. Include the Deacons who’s responsibilities shall include:
 - 1. The opening and closing of the church for every liturgical service.
 - 2. The counting, recording, and depositing of all offerings. Two Deacons shall be present for this function.
 - 3. Make sure there are an acolyte and reader for the service. To take care of a number of things that makes sure the service runs smoothly.

Resource Ministry

Just as the Treasurer’s Report for the month of October, 2016 brought encouragement in the form of enhanced revenue which left us with a small budget surplus as of the end of October, 2016, the figures for November, 2016 are, unfortunately, discouraging. Lower revenues than anticipated for the month of November, 2016 left us with November expenses exceeding revenue by a little over \$4,900. This left us with a deficit for the year as of November 30, 2016 of \$4,471. As of the writing of this report, it is our hope that traditional generous giving in the month of December, 2016 will aid in our efforts to finish the year with a budget surplus for the 15th consecutive time. Contributions to our benevolent enterprises continue at a healthy pace. Hopefully, the report appearing in the February, 2017 Newsletter will state that we were successful in reaching our goal of a budget surplus as of December 31, 2016. We are grateful for the generous support of the Congregation.


