

A Message from Pastor Hal

***My Very Best to You,
Dear Friends in Christ,***

Wow! What a great week of worship during Holy week and Easter! The problem was that I could not be there to celebrate with you. From what I heard, all went well. See what you all can do even without the presence of your interim pastor. Please don't get any ideas from that statement.

I thank God for the support from the Northeastern Ohio Synod, particularly Pastor Carl Biermann, and the supply pastor Landis Coffman for the great job he did.

I thank you for your prayers, cards, and text messages sent on my behalf. I was diagnosed as having atrial-fibulation and fluid on my lungs. The doctors did a cardiac inversion to get my heart back in rhythm and got most of the fluid drained from my lungs. Margie, my wife, had atrial-fibulation about a year ago. She also had a cardiac inversion and was in and out of the hospital on the same day. Don't know what that means. It is good to be back!

The month of May we will begin to use our Lay Eucharistic ministers to take the Eucharist on the days we celebrate Holy Communion at our worship services to our sick and shut-ins. This is a vital ministry to them – it lets them know they are not forgotten and are still an important part of our family. If you know of anyone who would like to receive this sacrament, please let me or the secretary know and we will be glad to take the Eucharist to them. At other times, during the week, I will take Communion to them. Our Lay Eucharistic ministers are: Mark Votaw, Juanita Bothal, Ron Tvorik, and Miriam Keating.

I will take the last two weeks in May as part of my vacation. We are going to have a garage sale. We have too many "treasures" and other "stuff" about which we need to divest ourselves and in which others may desire to invest.



Mother's Day Crossword





Spring Action Items! Message from Council President

Last week in the car after church, Casey Walters mentioned that he only has six more weeks of school this year. Wow! Time goes fast. Pastor Robarge led us through an interesting investigation of prayer throughout the Lenten season. Culminating with The Passover Haggadah and Seder Meal where we examined the Eucharist through the lens of the traditional Jewish Passover Observation. Thank you Pastor Hal and Pastor Coffman who stepped in to very ably cover while Pastor Hal recovered.



I cannot tell you how good it feels to have folks say things are going pretty well. I agree whole heartedly. Zion is doing Great things during the transition. Council has stepped up. Please notice last month's surplus! A little over \$700. The number of dollars is much less important than the fact that we are Taking Care of Business. Many churches have a big retraction during the transition period. People slow on attendance and in giving. This is not true for Zion. Attendance figures in 2017 have been very similar to 2016. Again, thank you all for your support both financial and personal.

I am a big fan of leaving meetings with Action Items; projects or tasks that folks take ownership of and get things done. So here is my Presidential List:

- Find some new folks to serve on Council.
 - We need at least 3 folks - See me or Carol if you are willing.
- Support the Call Committee in any way that they require.
- Build the "Pass the Baton Fund" to \$5000. This will be used for expenses incurred in order to bring in the new pastor and get his/her ministry off to a good start. MUTUAL MINISTRY

We will be having elections at our May 31st Congregational meeting. The following are the positions that are open on Council.

Vice President

The duties of the Vice President are to act for the President in the President's absence, chair the Ministry Development Team and assume such other duties as may be delegated by the President. The Ministry Development team provides annual reviews for the staff and can be a sounding board for Congregational concerns. They present nominations for positions to the Congregational Council and review the Constitution and By-Laws as needed.

Parish Life

The purpose of the Parish Life Ministry Team is to strengthen fellowship in our parish; to facilitate the integration of all members into the life of the congregation by encouraging participation in activities that will strengthen the sense of community that exists within this congregation. The Parish Life minister will report to the Council on the activities and needs of their supporting ministries; Women of the Church, Men of the church, Youth, Shepherd Program and LYO.

Social Ministry Team

Their purpose is to advocate and express love, justice and peace in the congregation and community at large, and to minister to the social concerns of those in need. The responsibilities of the team are to encourage members of the congregation in outreach, fellowship and benevolence.

As Vice President and a member of the Ministry Development team, I encourage you to prayerfully consider filling one of these positions, which are important to the life of our church. The terms are for 2 years and the Council meets once a month.

We will take a break this summer from Sunday School for all of our youth. We will start the new Sunday School year in September when we kick things off with Rally Day!


